GENERAL INFORMATION:

The current SFHS building was completed in 1962 with the class of '63 as the first graduating seniors. Through the years, continued growth has necessitated the construction of other buildings (or wings) to accommodate the student body. In addition to the 34 classrooms in the main building, there are 8 in the "B" wing, 11 in the "C" wing, and a new gymnasium, indoor track, and 9 classrooms in the "D" wing. Spanish Fork High School will complete the rebuild in Spring of 2024. This is a 360,000 Square Foot School with 80 Teaching Stations, 1,600-seat Auditorium with balcony, and 2 full gymnasiums. The new school will be adaptable and ready for technology-based learning while also having increased security measures and modern security systems.

COMMUNITY:

Spanish Fork City is a community of approximately 42,000 and is nestled at the base of the majestic Wasatch Mountains. The city is located 50 miles south of Salt Lake City. Two Franciscan Friars originally discovered this picturesque location on September 23, 1776. However, the city itself was not permanently settled until 1850 when a few hardy pioneer families pitched tents and dug crude houses out of the river bank along the Spanish Fork River.

A good education was important to these early settlers, and schools were some of the first permanent buildings erected in Spanish

Fork. At first students could only advance to the eighth-grade level, but in the fall of 1904 high school level classes were offered. In the spring of 1906, 11 students received a two-year high school diploma.
